# Transition Stirling - Re-Use Hub

Morag Sorbie gave a presentation on Stirling's Re-use hub.

The Stirling Reuse Hub is a warehouse space in Springkerse, dedicated to selling high quality pre-owned or upcycled furniture, household goods etc.

The Stirling Reuse Hub project aims to provide a space to make these goods available for reuse. This will range from goods and materials that:

- Are in excellent condition and just need a new home
- Just need some light repair or TLC
- Can be used for upcycling projects
- Can be remade or repurposed
- Materials for art projects
- Spare parts

They have 42 active volunteers and 20 makers, whose role range from warehousing to shop floor to social media to technical research. Twelve volunteers have moved on to paid employment. Stirling Reuse hub are encouraging young people to register for Saltire Awards.

Some of the projects that the volunteers have worked on are:

- Carbon tool for Scottish Reuse Sector
- Blether Bench
- Processing Stock
- Children's Workshop

Fallin Community Voice was established in January 2022 and consists of three trustees and a small number of volunteers. They are on a mission to improve Fallin.

Fallin Community Voice had a fantastic fun day in August and the event was well attended by everyone in the community. There were over 600 attendees, 300 of which were children. Thirty volunteers help made the fun day a success.

Fallin Community Voice raised enough funds in 2022 to be able to buy Christmas lights and a Christmas tree for the village.
